

MedicoLegal Guidepost

Informed Consent for Surgery

- 1. Informed Consent: This should include:
 - 1. Condition / disease of the patient
 - 2. Purpose and nature of intervention
 - 3. Consequences of the intervention
 - 4. All the alternatives options available
 - 5. Foreseeable risks involved
 - 6. Prognosis after / in absence of intervention
- 2. A doctor enjoys 'Therapeutic Privilege' to limit the disclosure if there is a possibility of sudden psychological impact to the detriment of the patient making him unnecessarily fearful and apprehensive.
- 3. If an additional procedure is deemed necessary during a surgery, its important to bring the patient out of anesthesia and take consent and plan the procedure subsequently unless its a life threatening or emergency procedure. If need of additional procedure can be anticipated preoperatively, the consent for the same should also be taken with the consent of the main procedure preoperatively.
- 4. Its important to document availability of non invasive options with it's failed trial or patient's refusal for the same before undertaking surgery.
- 5. In case of emergency procedures / unconscious patient / mentally challenged patient / accidental victim / child brought in emergency by school authority; it is implied that the procedure is required to save the life / limb / organ of the patient. It is preferable to take consent of two qualified specialists whenever possible.

The third **Advancements in Endourology** (AIE) live operative international workshop was organized by Gujarat urology association and Shyam urosurgical hospital on 23-25th February 2018 at Ahmedabad. AIE conference is organized every two yearly by Dr.Kandarp Parikh focusing mainly on minimal access surgeries in the field of Endourology. The event was attended by 573 delegates from across the world along with 10 international and 37 national faculty. 18 live surgeries covering all the modalities of stone and BPH were demonstrated by experts. High lights of the conference were:

- Master class on RIRS AND PCNL by Dr.Olivier Traxer and Dr.Swen Lahme respectively.
- Robotic Prostatectomy for BPH by Dr.Mihir Desai from Los Angels.
- Robotic flexible ureteroscopy by Dr.Kandarp Parikh.



Clinical training Endourology workshop was organised by Cook Vista at MGM Medical College and hospital, Aurangabad on 8 th April 2018, Sunday. Live operative surgeries (Miniperc and RIRS) were performed by Dr. Nanjappa and Dr. Abhay Mahajan. Lecture series contained complete coverage on RIRS & MINIPERC Around 45 delegates attended the workshop including residents & urologist interested in Endourology. Dr. Abhay Mahajan was the organizing Secretary of the workshop.

The event spread over three days from 16th April to 18th April 2018. Better Approach to Incontinence after Prostate Surgery: ATOMS - Adjustable Trans Obturator Male Sling



- 1. What's ATOMS and where is it used?
 - Adjustable Trans Obturator Male Sling system for Male urinary incontinence due to Post RARP/ TURP/ Post urethroplasty predominantly for stress urinary incontinence. It can be used even in Post RT after RARP patients. Since it is not patient controlled it can be used even for patients with dementia and mentally retarded.
- 2. Is there any evidence and outcome for ATOMS?

 It's been in use for nearly twelve years. There have been more than fifteen trials in which a continence rate of up to 88-97% has been achieved.
- 3. What are the parts of ATOMS System?
 Suburethral substitute sphincter cushion, Catheter, Scrotal Port, Mesh arms for fixation, Fixation sutures, Tunneller.
- 4. What does the hydraulic system do?

 Hydraulic system substitutes urinary sphincter function in incontinent males by compressing the midbulbar urethra underneath bulbospongiosus muscle. The symmetrical positioning below the urethra is achieved by a 4-point fixation. The small, pre-attached scrotal port is palpated with ease and topped up by the urologist.
- 5. Why do we have to do a four point fixation?

 The integrated mesh arms are drawn back around the inferior pubic ramus to the middle of the implant to secure the system in place. This eliminates the need for additional fasteners or screws, and ensures a symmetrical 4-point fixation





We at Kokilaben Dhirubhai Ambani Hospital, Mumbai conducted a live operative workshop on the 15th April 2018 where three procedure of ATOMS was demonstrated by Dr Steve Foley Consultant Urologist from Royal Berkshire Hospital UK. Patients who had moderate urinary stress incontinence post robotic radical prostatectomy were taken up for this procedure.

Highlights of Dr. Oliver Traxer's Master Class

- 1. Think Ergonomy and be comfortable
- 2. Endoscopes
 - 1. Less than 9Fr
 - 2. Be very gentle and never force: cases of retained digital flexible ureteroscopes requiring second procedure to remove them
 - 3. Macrorotation proximally and micro rotation distally where the scope enters the ure-
 - 4. Assessing the lower calyx with a combination of active and passive deflection
 - 5. Tip flexibility for lower pole access: fiber optic scopes are superior to digital scopes
 - 6. Bubbles always indicate anterior calyces at 12h00;
 - 7. When you see the fiber you are safe for your scope: fibre should protrude 1/4th of the diameter of view.
- 3. Irrigation
 - 1. Inject but never aspirate
 - 2. No intermittent manual pressure or pressure bag
- 4. Ureteral access:
 - 1. Below the wire
 - 2. Engaging the orifice: rotation followed by deflection and then push when the orifice is in middle of the screen
 - 3. Right UO between 9 and 12; Left UO between 12 and 3 O' clock.
- 5. UAS: as small as possible, never force, stay below UPJ
- 6. Holmium YAG Laser
 - 1. Always start with dusting and proceed to to dusting / fragmentation according to stone volume and composition
 - 2. Stone volume is more important than the largest stone diameter
 - 3. From the surface to the centre
 - 4. Fibre: use the small one (200-273): same efficiency, more flexibility, more irrigation and less retropulsion

- 7. Lower pole stones
 - 1. Relocalisation if possible
 - 2. Single use laser fibre
 - 3. Small < 270 microns
 - 4. Cut the tip!
 - 5. Low energy (<0.5J)
 - 6. Fragmentation and relocalization
- 8. Laser ablation of TCC
 - 1. Long pulse, 1J, 10Hz, 10 Watts
 - 2. Don't touch the tumor
