





34th ANNUAL WZ-USICON - RAIPUR - REPORT

Online Crash Course On Research & Publication Methodology - Webinars

USI West zone conduced an Online Crash Course on Research and Publication methodology on 19 and 26 November 2024. "Publish or Perish". This is an adage which holds true today. The need to start doing research begins with identifying the unmet needs in a clinical situation. There have been several instances wherein the research Idea is robust, but the study design and execution are poor. As a result, the conclusions drawn are inconclusive and irrelevant. This emphasizes the fact and need to inculcate ideas of research methodology which is scientific. With this need in mind USI WZ aimed to conduct this crash course is to initiate these ideas in the young minds. The target audience of the session were trainees and the members in carrying research. As the topic was vast, it was scheduled in two sessions with enough buffer time for audience interaction.

The objectives of this session were to educate members how to formulate a research question and on aspects of study methodology while designing the study. In addition, emphasis was also given on educating the members practical aspects and basics in statistics required for a study design. Having done proper research another important issue of choosing a correct journal for publication, identifying ghost journal, and impact factor and other aspect of manuscript writing were also discussed. These session were convened and moderated by Dr. Prashant Mulawkar and Dr. Arvind Ganpule.

The first session was held on 19th November 2024. Session opened with initial comments by President elect Dr. Ajay Bhandarkar and Hon. Secretary Dr. Rajesh Kukreja. Dr. Apul Goel Editor of Indian Journal of Urology made introductory remarks. This was followed by didactic lectures covering various topics like types of studies, study design and research process by Dr. Gagan Gautam, intricacies of formulating a research question (PICOT, FINER) by Dr. Arvind Ganpule, study methodology, patient selection, randomization by Dr. Arun Chawla, process of literature search, reference management by Dr. Rajesh Kukreja and talk on basics of biostatistics by Dr. Prashant Mulawkar. The second session was held on 26th November 2024.

WZ president Dr. Ashish Patil and Hon secretary Dr. Rajesh Kukreja, IJU editor Dr. Apul Goel initiated the session with their opening remarks. The second session

Dr. Pankaj N Maheshwari






